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Notes p1:

- This model allows us to bubble year groups and minimise social mixing between year groups as much as possible – this is not absolute. Students will not be in pods (where they stay in the same room throughout the day). Students will transit from one lesson to the next and be taught by their subject specialist teachers – we cannot afford more loss of learning.
- This plan will continue to be reviewed on a weekly basis by the SLT however it is intended to be operating, in this fashion, for the autumn term.
- We will continue with the use of classroom external doors for students to enter and exit their lessons. This minimises corridor traffic in narrow areas and places children in the outdoors (more ventilation). We will continue to use the one-way (anti-clockwise) system around the perimeter of the main school buildings. The inner path around the front of the school buildings will continue to only be accessible to staff and students throughout the day – not parents or younger siblings who do not attend our school. Students will not go to lockers between any lessons (this is mentioned later). If it's wet, students wear their coats as they transit around the outside of the building.
- No change to School Bus service required. We will share our plan to bubble year groups with Dorset Travel – it will be up to them to decide how/if they will apply additional control conditions on their buses. ***Unless a student has a genuine medical reason, all students travelling to school by bus (school or public service) must wear a face mask at all times.***

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Notes p2:

- We will continue with students wearing full and correct uniform in November. We expect the weather to turn colder as we move more into autumn and then winter. We strongly encourage students to 'layer up' underneath their school uniform, items such as white vests, long-sleeve t-shirts, thermal tops are fantastic. We will continue to keep rooms well ventilated with windows and internal doors open. Our heating will be on when necessary! When it gets really cold, like all other schools nationally we will allow students to wear coats in classrooms. Hats and gloves are not allowed to be worn in lessons, neither are hoods allowed to be up as they can disrupt writing (gloves) and behaviour management (eye to eye contact with the teacher). In some lessons, such as PE and D&T, coats might not be allowed to be worn for health and safety reasons.
- Students will continue to wear PE/Games kit for the whole day when it is on their timetable to avoid the need to get changed. If it is forecast for wet weather then students will bring either dry school uniform or dry PE kit in a bag which they can change into at the end of their PE/Games lesson if required. Changing Rooms have been temporarily relabelled as Changing Room 1 and 2, not 'boys' and 'girls'. Students will use changing rooms to store their bags/belongings so mixed classes will go into the same area. If students are wet and do need to change into dry school uniform, this will be managed by the PE staff via single sex groups.
- Year group collective worships will continue to happen – one year group each day: Tuesday Year 5, Wednesday Year 6, Thursday Year 7 and Friday Year 8. The Sports Hall allows for socially distancing tutor groups.

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Notes p3:

- Students can still use their locker. They will only access their locker twice during the day, before morning registration (via tutor rooms) and at the end of the day. The main purpose for them having their locker is to put their mobile phone away – no mobile phones in lessons. Students will be expected to carry most of their belongings, including their packed lunch (if they have one) to every lesson. If a student's mobile phone is seen out it will be confiscated immediately and then taken to the Main Office. The student's parent is then informed and is required to collect the phone at the end of the school day.
- Hand hygiene for all students – hand sanitisers are in every classroom. Students are encouraged to wash their hands whenever possible in lessons (science labs, art room, PE changing rooms) and when they go to the toilet. At break and lunch times the ground floor Barnes Building toilets and the toilets in The Street (only accessible via the door at the Rez end of The Street) are available for students to access. The toilets by Rooms 1, 2 and 3 and the toilets in the Year 5 & 6 area are not available for students at break and lunch times because we are minimising student corridor access and disruption to lessons happening in nearby classrooms.
- Sadly, we have decided not to run any homework clubs, intervention groups or after school clubs until further notice. Aside from the 'Out of Hours' which can run in a large ventilated space with the same staffing, nothing else will run after school. This is because those members of staff who offer all the other provision are exposed to additional students by doing so and we consider this unnecessary exposure. We will still run our Early Birds and Breakfast Club every morning because we can do this without exposing additional staff.
