Dear Parents and Carers,

This is a newsletter update in addition to the more regular updates on our school Facebook page. We are very pleased to be back in school and teaching face to face. We hope that you have found everything you need in recent mailings, including the guidance on homework and also Covid 19 symptoms. A few of our students have been dealing with Covid-based anxiety or some anxiety about being back in school routines; in the main we are now settled and learning well, whilst continuing to support any quite understandable anxiety on an individual basis.

#### Trips in 2021

We know that all of our year groups look forward to their residentials. We have pencilled in dates as per the key dates sheet with our trip providers. Week commencing 24th May for Year 7, 21st June for Year 5, 28th June for Year 6 and 5th July for Year 8. Our insurers have advised that due to the uncertainty around Covid 19 we should not begin to place deposits yet as they will be unprotected. We do not want to expose families to financial risk. The DfE will need to give us permission to run residentials again (at the moment there is a ban) for the situation to change. We all hope that early in the new year we are able to give you full residential information and book places but we ask for your understanding that this may be late notice or not happen at all.

#### **Safeguarding Reminder**

As many of our pupils are now bringing their mobile phones to school, can we please ask parents to support us by reiterating the following key safeguarding rules to the children;

- the camera function is NOT used outside the home on school days
- photographs should NOT be taken when wearing St. Osmund's uniform or PE kit
- If children have photographs or images of themselves or other children wearing school uniform / PE kit, images should NOT be shared or posted on either the internet or social media.



A number of children are not permitted to be photographed for parental or legal reasons. Also any image of a child posted online associating them with a school (i.e. via its logo) can sadly lead to identification by anyone using the internet or social media to prey upon young people.

We are keen that children understand our reasons and embrace the use of their phones positively and sensitively. Inappropriate use of phones will result in them being confiscated with parents asked to collect them from the school office.

We are delighted with the change to the v-neck sweatshirts, they certainly help us to look even smarter!


#### **School Communications**
