What is the grammar and language of our persuasive letter?	
Conditional form	Starting a sentence with the subordinating conjunction 'if':  If it's in pupils' lunch boxes and at their milk breaks today, then it's poisoning rivers tomorrow and contaminating our oceans forever.
Subjunctive form	A very formal way of speaking and writing. Usually using the form 'if he /she/it/l were':  If it were possible to eliminate all single use plastic from school, this would have a huge impact on community use of plastic.
Passive Voice	A way of writing sentences that enables the writer to remove the subject of the sentence:  In our school alone, on average, 400 packets of crisps are eaten a day.
Semi-colon	Can be used to join two independent clauses that are related:  We know plastic is a remarkable invention; it gives us life changing medical equipment such as surgical gloves and prosthetic limbs.
Formal	Language used when writing or speaking about something important:  The issue of single-use plastic is particularly pertinent to our school setting, where the majority of students partake in lunches from home.
Impersonal	Formal, no personal pronouns (I, he, she, you). Often includes third person, present tense, passive voice.  The school community needs to work together to overcome this.
